The meaning of the Double Dorje. *Dorje* is a Tibetan word meaning “noble stone.” It embodies the brilliance of diamond-like illumination and symbolizes the indestructible source of power from which all else is born. Like a diamond, the dorje is a reminder of that which is enduring, invincible, and irresistible. The double dorje has the additional power to protect all that is sacred and mundane. Wearing the protective double dorje helps strengthen our core while it empowers one pointed focus and inner strength. It reminds us to serve The Sacred, which lives at the center of our being.

All Karla’s jewelry is hand crafted with caring and consciousness (for more, go to [http://tulkugold.com/.](http://tulkugold.com/)) In keeping with Karla’s intention to bring the greatest blessings, support, and peace to each person who wears it, every piece is blessed after its creation by a woman named Mata. She is considered an incarnation of the Divine Mother in the form of Vajrayogini. From her small home in an



ancient part of Kathmandu she performs sacred healing work and is a channeler and seer for local people.

Rajendra Bajracharya, the master repousse artist who does the repousse work on Karla's deity and chakra jewelry lines, is also a Buddhist priest. The devotion behind his workmanship is apparent in the refined and uplifting quality of the pieces he produces.

Pancha Dhatu. In ancient India, Nepal, and Tibet, sacred objects were cast using the lost wax method from an alloy known as pancha dhatu, or five metals. When combined, these five metals—gold, silver, copper, zinc, and tin—are believed to create an alchemy infused with healing and protective powers.

Tulku Gold jewels—like the name they embody—represent the rebirth of spirit into a new form. They are tools to remind us of our divine nature which is unbounded by time or space.

The Tulku Gold jewelry lines are designed by Karla Refojo and created by Newar master goldsmiths in Kathmandu, Nepal. The 24k gold amulets are hand crafted with devotion by a Buddhist priest—consciously infused with the power inherent in traditions where there is no separation between pure spirituality and the act of creation. Through wearing these amulets, that power supports, inspires, and protects us on our Path.

The mission at Tulku is to keep the ancient Himalayan artistic and spiritual traditions alive through sharing them with the Western world.
